- 1. Sloan Kettering perspective:
 - a. Cores need to come back first before faculty can
 - b. Schools are closed so it is hard for employees to return
 - c. Managing schedules will be bad
 - d. Soft opening May 4
 - e. They are controlling where lunch is and how many chairs are available for seating
 - f. Need to work with HR to accommodate flexible scheduling needs because of kids & illness
- 2. Can-CC is putting together some recommendations
 - a. It seem as if most thing the Cores have to come first
 - b. If public schools aren't open, it isn't going to be feasible
- 3. Core startup might be more difficult for self services on cores
 - a. Might have to limit it to super users or change to a staff run
 - b. Keyboards need to be disinfected
 - c. Resupplying PPE that was donated will be a challenge
- 4. Universities are doing infrastructure work during this time and so power outages are a problem for some, especially if they can't monitor the instruments remotely.
- 5. One person has a three hour window that they are allowed to be in the building, which makes it hard to maintain instruments
- 6. Does your University have a supply of masks? How are staff supposed to get them if they are required to wear them?
 - a. Need UV-C radiation to kill the virus and reuse the mask
 - b. UV-C hoods?
- 7. Are the Cores included on the relaunch committee?
 - a. UMBC has a Core committee that has a liaison on the relaunch committee
- 8. Rates: How are they going to be handled with these huge deficits?
 - a. Ask for rate setting questions for the next call.
